

Grand Olde West Days
Draft Horse Show and Feed Team Race
Rules and Regulations

This is a Draft Horse show with hitch classes and open classes.

1. The heavy hitch classes are open to draft horse breeds including Belgians, Clydesdales, Percheron's, Shires, suffolk's and grade horses of these breeds. Heavy breeds are defined as a horse weighing 1,500 pounds or more.
2. Light breed of driving horses will be able to enter the open classes including Farm Team Class, Obstacle Course, 4- up hitch, Novice class and youth Jr. Classes. Light breed is defined as a horse weighing less than 1,500 pounds.
3. All (including Mules) are invited to enter the jackpot Feed Team Race.
4. Any horse(s) out of control or seemingly dangerous (as determined by judges/ Ring Steward) will be asked to leave the arena/ grounds and will forfeit entry fees/ premium money. In addition, the owner of the animals determined to be unsafe will be responsible for paying for all damages.
5. Exhibitors make entry at their own risk and release Moffat County Fair Grounds, Colorado Draft Horse Association, and the Grand Olde West Days Draft Horse show Committee, from all liability of any kind, including the loss of property that may be incurred due to accidents.
6. Entries for all animals must be received by June 12th 2018. Later entries may be accepted until 8:30am on June 12th, 2018, if space allows. Late entry fee is \$20 per class. Late entries for the Jackpot Feed Team Race must be paid in Cash.
7. Stalls are provided at the Moffat County Fair Grounds. Cost is \$10/ stall. **Horses may arrive as early as May 27th to the 29th to participate. For extended arrangements, please contact the Moffat County Fair Grounds office prior to arrival. There will be a \$20 hook up fee for all overnight campers on the fairgrounds payable to the Moffat County Fairgrounds. There will be a parade on Saturday, all are welcome to join!
8. Each exhibitor must wear the correct number for that class. The number may be attached to person or cart or wagon.
9. No Dogs.
10. **All decisions by judges are final.** Anyone creating an unfavorable scene will be asked to leave the grounds and forfeit any entry fees/ premiums.

11. Health Requirements:

- a. Out of State Horses: A health certificate obtained within the last 30 days and documentation of a negative Coggins test within the last 12 months.
Note: Colorado is a Brand Inspection state.
- b. For all horses safety, it is recommended that your horses have a vet examination and have received all recommended vaccinations within the year.

Show Rules

12. Contestants will get 3 calls per class. After the 3rd call, the gates will close. No exceptions! Please note this when signing up for classes.
13. For safety reasons, one adult rider must be on the seat with any and all Junior Youth Class participants. Farm team events, an adult may walk along Jr. Driver.
14. Junior driver must be between the ages of 8 and 15. The signature of a parent / guardian on the entry form indicates that the youth exhibitor possesses the skills to safely handle the horses.
15. All animals, wagons, and harnesses should be clean and in good condition. All exhibitors and assistants should dress appropriately.
16. No person shall be permitted in the ring during the time of the judging of classes except the judge, ring steward, exhibitor, and one groom or header for each exhibit. Any person attempting to interfere with the duties of the judge(s) and /or ring steward may be asked to leave the facility and shall forfeit any entry fees and /or premiums.
