Although membership to the Colorado Draft Horse Association is not mandatory to show, we do encourage anyone who enjoys draft horses to join. All exhibitors will be required to sign a waiver of liability upon entering classes. Please send signed waiver with entry if pre-registering.

All classes are open to Youth exhibitors. However, ALL Youth exhibitors must be accompanied by an adult driver at all times and for all driving classes. Youth ages 10-17 as of January 01, 2018

Registration opens at 7:30 a.m. day of show.

Halter Mares must be entered by 8:30 a.m. All other classes must be entered 1 class prior to start of respective class. **Those exhibitors competing for the Hi-Point must have ALL classes entered at the beginning of the show. It is not permissible to “enter as you go”.**

DONATIONS/PROCEEDS: Details concerning proceeds donations to CDHA are TBA. Percentages of proceeds from this Fund Raiser donated to CDHA chapters are at the sole discretion of Eternal Hope Equestrian Centre, LLC. We would like to reward the Chapters that participate in the show proportionately. Proceeds from this Fund Raiser donated to CDHA Youth Scholarship Fund is at the sole discretion of Eternal Hope Equestrian Centre, LLC.

For Example: If the show proceeds are \$ 100.00 and Chapter participation percentages are as follows:

Northern 25%, Southern 50%, Mountain 25%, Eastern 0%

Monies donated back to each Chapter would then be as follows:

Northern= \$25.00, Southern= \$50.00, Mountain= \$25.00, Eastern \$ 0.00

By donating only proportionately to the participation from each Chapter, we're making it possible for Chapters as a whole to control how much money they earn for their chapter. We would like to reward those Chapters who are active. Donating this way, all CDHA chapters have an equal opportunity to raise funds for their chapter.

Under Colorado Law

CLASSES OFFERED:

- A. HALTER MARES
 - All ages. Decorations and show halters optional. Horse should possess ideal characteristics for the breed. Judged on correctness of conformation and gait.
- B. HALTER GELDINGS
 - All ages. Decorations and show halters optional. Horse should possess ideal characteristics for the breed. Judged on correctness of conformation and gait.
- C. WALK/TROT UNDER SADDLE
 - English or Western tack and attire acceptable. Horse and Rider judged on overall correctness and appearance- rider's seat, hands; horse's gait, head set, overall manner.
- D. PLEASURE CART- SINGLE
 - Any 2 wheeled vehicle acceptable. Fore cart, show cart, road cart, etc. Horse and Driver judged. Easier, pleasant way of going desired.
- E. SHOW CART - SINGLE
 - Any 2 wheeled vehicle acceptable. Fore cart, show cart, road cart, etc. Horse and Driver judged. Action and showier appearance desired.
- F. WORKING TEAM ON THE RAIL
 - Any 2 or 4 wheeled vehicle acceptable. No implements. Horses and Driver judged.
- G. SHOW TEAM ON THE RAIL
 - Any 2 or 4 wheeled vehicle acceptable. No implements. Horses and Driver judged. Action and showier appearance desired.
- H. GROUND DRIVING OBSTACLE- SINGLE OR TEAM
 - Novice horse(s) and/or Novice drivers/handlers ONLY. Horses being entered in vehicle drawn classes are NOT eligible. This class will be JUDGED on precision and finesse. Youth are eligible (even with a horse that is used in classes with free-wheeling vehicles) Time maximum TBD. Not counted toward Hi-Point.
- I. OBSTACLE- SINGLE
 - Forecarts- Bring your own. Forecarts may be provided. Timed. 10 second faults. No disqualifications.
- J. OBSTACLE- TEAM
 - Forecarts- Bring your own. Forecarts may be provided. Timed. 10 second faults. No disqualifications.
- K. LOG SKID- SINGLE OR TEAM
 - Open to Single or Team. Cart or No Cart. Log Provided. WALK ONLY. Timed. 10 second faults.
- L. FEED TEAM RACE
 - With Sled (Provided). Consists of 1 driver, 1 swamper. Timed.

Judge(s) have final decision for any and all classes/situations/discrepancies.

Exhibitors will be called by exhibitor number. Please know your number.

For classes where one exhibitor at a time performs, order called is order in which exhibitors will enter arena and show. An exhibitor is either 'UP', 'ON DECK' or 'IN THE HOLE'. When an exhibitor is:

1. 'UP'- exhibitor must promptly enter the arena on gateman's cue.
2. 'ON DECK'- exhibitor needs to be waiting at the gate, ready to show.
3. 'IN THE HOLE'- exhibitor should be near the arena preparing to show.

For Class C. Walk/Trot Under Saddle: In the event that your horse is traveling at a faster speed than the horse(s) ahead of you, safe passing to the inside will be allowed. It is advised to alert the rider you're passing verbally.

For Class H. Ground Driving Obstacle, Class I. & J. Obstacle, Class K. Log Skid - Each obstacle course will be posted in print at the office and near exhibitor's entrance gate the day of the show. There will NOT be a walk through beforehand.

For Class H. Ground Driving Obstacle- This class is designed for horses that are either in training/novice/green, etc. Horses entered in this class are not allowed to be entered in any vehicle drawn classes (unless being driven by Youth), however, horses entered in the ground driving class are also eligible for the following classes: Halter, Under Saddle, Feed Team Race and Log Skid (provided no cart is used for the log skid).

For Class L. Feed Team Race- Walk/Trot ONLY. Cantering will not be allowed. Canter strides = 10 sec. penalty per offense/stride. Horses performing a 4 beat canter will also be penalized 10 sec per offense/stride. Horses must be in either a 2 beat trotting gait, or a 4 beat walking gait. Each obstacle disturbed = 10 sec. penalty. Each Balk/Refusal resulting in a Broken Pattern = 30 sec. penalty (per obstacle station). Each damaged item (broken string, chipped tub, spilled oats, etc) = 10 sec. Anything lost off sled = 10 sec. penalty. No hay hooks or other assistance devices. Driver must stay on sled at all times. Sled must be completely stopped before swamper proceeds to either load, unload, jump on/jump off. Teamsters will be allowed two attempts to ask horses to proceed forward with loaded sled.

FOR CLASS H., CLASS I., CLASS J., CLASS K.- Obstacles may include but will NOT BE LIMITED TO: Performing a Fan- consisting of a 90° swing, 180° swing, Long distance backing, serpentine backing, docking and settling, full 360° turn in restricted area, spooky flapping objects, stacked hay, stacked tubs, cones, simulated bridge, barrels, gate, etc. Printed Pattern/Course will be posted day of show with written instructions. No walk through prior to class.

FOR CLASS K.- Log Skid. Trotting results in 10 sec. penalty. Loping strides results in 10 sec. penalty. Disturbance of obstacles results in 10 sec. penalty.

VEHICLES: 2 WHEELED: For classes where 2 wheeled vehicles are acceptable: fore carts, training carts, show carts, road carts, meadow brooks, etc. are allowed.

VEHICLES: 4 WHEELED: For classes where 4 wheeled vehicles are acceptable: full fifth wheels, fifth wheels and non-fifth wheels are all allowed.

Exhibitors competing for DAY OF Hi-Point and Reserve Hi-Point awards- Because we are offering a day of Hi-Point award and this award is granted per (1) unique exhibitor and (1) unique horse duo: a team of horses may compete in Class I. and/or Class J and/or Class K. and/or Class L. more than once. This is to allow each unique driver/horse duo a chance to compete for the Hi-Point. Exhibitors cannot share a single horse, but may need to share a team in order to go for the Hi-Point.

For Example:

Jane Doe is showing her horse Prince in Halter Geldings, Walk/Trot Under Saddle, Obstacle (team) and Feed Team Race- She is going for the Hi-Point award. (Jane and Prince are a unique duo)

John Doe is showing his horse Princess in Halter Mares, Walk/Trot Under Saddle, Obstacle (team) and Feed Team Race- He too is going for the Hi-Point award. (John and Princess are a unique duo)

Prince and Princess are team mates for the Obstacle (team) and Feed Team race. In order for Jane and John to each compete for the Hi-Point, they each will need to drive the Prince and Princess team in the Obstacle class and Feed Team Race.

NO substitutions of horse or handler!

If you own multiple horses and are competing for the Day Of Hi-Point, you must choose only one horse and use that one unique horse to complete your unique duo- Since team horses are often very well matched in size, color and markings- THIS IS ON YOUR HONOR.

This show is designed for training purposes. Training equipment will be acceptable in the ring, however, only Humane training devices will be allowed. Devices such as electric shock, wire head/mouth pieces and running W's and the like, will NOT be allowed. Exhibitors found using devices deemed In-humane (by Show Judge or E.H.E.C. staff) will be asked to discontinue use of said device. Refusal to comply will be grounds for dismissal without refund. And said exhibitor will be required to leave premises immediately. In-humane handling will follow same guidelines.

Under Colorado Law

This show is designed to give trainers and horse owners/handlers a chance to get their young/inexperienced horses into a new/exciting atmosphere and/or “fix” training issues in the ring that otherwise often go unchecked due to high stakes in the show ring. Although this is a training show, any horse seemingly dangerous or potentially out of control (as deemed by judges or E.H.E.C. staff) will be asked to leave the ring and/or premises immediately in order to maintain a safe environment for all exhibitors and their horses.

Horses are NOT REQUIRED to be shod.

Exhibitors will be provided with their Exhibitor number and must wear that number in each class entered. The number may be attached to either their person or drawn vehicle. Number should appear on back/hip of person showing halter. Number should appear on back or saddle pad of person for riding class.

Exhibitors are allowed (1) Header/Groom in the arena at the appropriate time.

Only the Judge(s), Ring Stewards, authorized personnel and exhibitors are allowed in the arena during classes.

Out of state horses must obtain a current health certificate and proof of current negative coggins. We do not require proof of vaccinations, however, for all horse safety, current vaccinations are advised.

AWARDS:

Each class will award the top 10 exhibitors with a ribbon. 1st place ribbons will be accompanied by a 1st place trophy.

Supreme halter horse and Reserve Supreme halter horse trophies will be awarded. Hi-Point and Reserve Hi-Point Trophies will be awarded at the end of the day to the exhibitor/horse unique duo with the most points. The more classes you enter, the higher your chances are of winning the Hi-Point. **More Classes = More potential Points.** To be eligible to win either of the Hi-Point awards, you must enter (1) halter class and at least (3) other classes. Hi-Point awards based on (1) unique exhibitor and (1) unique horse Duo. Swapping horses/exhibitors for different classes to come up with (4) required classes will not be allowed. Horse must be the same horse for all required Hi-Point classes (this is on your honor). **Ground Driving Class does NOT count toward Hi-Point.**

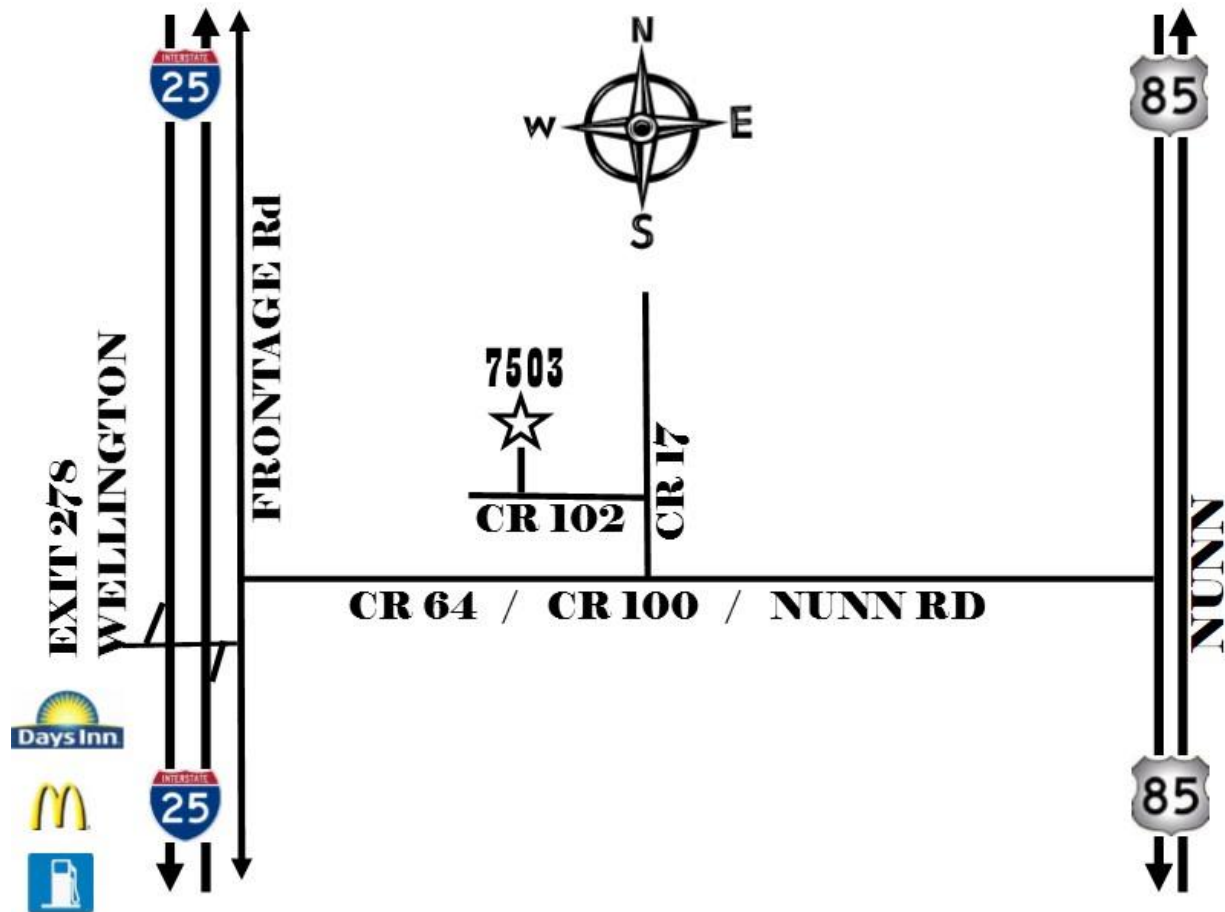
